

## English 3 Summer Reading Preview Spring 2018

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





As you remember from last year, all Wego student participate in summer reading. This year, current tenth graders who are enrolled in English 3 for the 2018-2019 school year have seven books to choose from on their summer reading list. Your job is to preview these titles. Then, choose and read ONE before we start school in August.

Please enjoy the book you choose like a “beach read.” You will be assessed on your reading and will complete a variety of assignments, but your English 3 teacher will help you prepare you in the fall. Annotating is not required during the summer.

**Most of these books have a few things in common.** In general, these books address social justice issues using a variety of genres and topics. *Tom Sawyer*, a classic satire, varies greatly from the memoir, *In the County We Love* by Diane Guerrero, the non-fiction graphic novel, *March* by John Lewis, or the post-apocalyptic sci-fi novel *Rot and Ruin*; however, each offers social commentary.

This summer, spend a few hours reading one of these books for pleasure - for fun. Enjoy your summer. Enjoy summer reading! This can include books from the summer reading list, your local library, online sources, etc. All reading is good reading.
